

Message From Fr Bing

The Epiphany of the Lord Sunday: **Set Our Eyes on the Lord** [Mt 2:1-12](#)

The Feast of the Nativity of our Lord re-enforces the truth of His real identity; that He is the true God and true man, the incarnate Son of God. The Feast of the Epiphany celebrates the revelation of God in Jesus Christ. He is the light of the world, who gives light to all nations. His light invites us into the radiance of the saving promise of God. The Second Vatican Council calls this radiance: *Lumen Gentium*, Jesus Christ as the “Light of All Nation.”


God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God. When we recite the Nicene Creed, we profess this truth; and we celebrate the fact that through Jesus’ birth, God’s light shines on all nations. The song **Shine Jesus Shine** echoes this truth: *Lord, the light of your love is shining in the midst of the darkness, shining, Jesus, Light of the world shine upon us. Set us free by the truth you now bring us. Shine on me, shine on me.* The true light of Jesus shines on all nations. On all people to overcome the darkness of our lives and bring us His life. The same light that Isaiah echoes in the first reading; *Rise in splendor Jerusalem! Your light has come; the glory of the Lord shines upon you.* Putting ourselves for Jerusalem, we hear God telling us to rise in the splendor because the light of Jesus Christ now shines on us all.

The Magi from the east are perfect examples of this disposition, *rise in splendor*. They see the star of the Lord travel in search of the glory of God that shines upon all nations, Jesus Christ, the newborn King of the universe. Their disposition and their action are what every one of us should imitate. They rise and set out following the star, the guiding light of Christ: *We saw His star at its rising and have come to do him homage.* Let us strive to follow the STAR of Jesus. Let us have that constant inner desire to encounter the God of love, the light that could dispel all the darkness in our lives.

The Magi arrive in Bethlehem - where the star leads them to the child Jesus, and JOY fills them. The presence of Jesus brings so much joy and peace, the sign of salvation that He brings. They came to do Him homage, an example for all of us; the first thing the Christian religion demands is to worship God. Worship of God involves offering, and the magi exemplify this; opening their gifts, they brought *frankincense, myrrh, and gold*. The *frankincense* represents His priesthood, *myrrh* represents His being a prophet (his passion), and gold represents Kingship. He is the King of all kings. But for us, the greatest gift we can give God is the gift of ourselves. St. Paul says: *I urge you, therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God.* (Rom. 12:1)

From the beginning, going back to the days of John the Baptist, the mission of Jesus is clear. The proclamation of the Kingdom of God. Disciples share this missionary aspect of our faith - proclaim it to the ends of the world. Our Lord transcends time, space, and people. He is not for sole keeping but for all and for always. The blessings given to us are not for us to keep. We must share our graces and our FAITH. Disciples should not just be Joyful receivers but also Joyful givers!

Think about this: In the Nativity scene, the eyes of Joseph and Mary are on the child Jesus. The secret of true peace is like their gaze - focus on adoration - let us also fix our eyes on Jesus in the Eucharist. Notice that the eyes of Joseph and Mary focus not on their poor surroundings, the shepherds, the Magi, or their gifts. Neither are they focused on each other. Let us focus on the Lord and the mission – because He has given us in this life.

Faith and Fear

When I was little, you could tell I believed in the destructive power of the monsters who lived beneath my bed because I would never let my ankles anywhere near the bottom of the mattress. (It's common knowledge that bare ankles are premium monster bait — ask any child you know).

You can often tell what a person believes by what they fear.

But here's the thing: belief isn't always enough. It's obvious that Herod believed in Christ's power because of how terrified he was by it and by the room he made in his life for the possible impact of the Messiah. In fact, if belief was the only measure of orthodoxy, you could stand most modern Christians next to Herod and he would tower above them.

Remember, there's something just as bad as disobeying God: discounting Him. I know I am guilty of that in a thousand small ways each day. In the person I ignore or the opinion I sneer at. In the unkind words I let roll from my tongue. In the prayers of thanksgiving that I don't say because I am "too busy."

I believe in God, but I do not fear Him — mostly because my very modern understanding of the concept of "fear" would lump God in with those monsters beneath my bed.

But what if we understood fear in a more traditional sense — awe, reverence, and wonder? "All kings shall pay him homage, all nations shall serve him." — Psalm 72:11



When Herod heard the news of the coming of the Messiah, it compelled him to do something. Not the right thing, mind you, but something. It moved him into action.
